



- Add the eggs to the bowl one at a time beating between each addition. Add the peanut butter, vanilla extract, baking soda and salt. Mix until well combined.

Stewardship: Being Present

"There is no time like the present": at least that's the saying, anyway. Yet most churches don't focus on the present when talking about their stewardship campaigns. Generally, they are meant to spur enthusiasm for the future of the church. For the goals ahead and the vision of what might be. But like an autumn walk to a valley overlook, sometimes we miss the beauty of the trees around us for the photo Op at the end. Which is why this year we wanted our stewardship campaign to focus on the here and now. Right now, our church is facing a financial deficit, low attendance, and declining membership. This is where we need to focus our energy for the moment.

Right now, we are experiencing loss; we have lost several people who were very present in the life of the church. Right now, we are experiencing a large discrepancy between pledged giving and the cost of maintaining the church. Right now, we are experiencing low attendance on Sunday mornings, and even lower attendance at special events. These are the worries of the church, the places that call for your compassion, patience, prayers, and contributions.

Losing the members that we have to death, relocation, and other worshiping communities is a source of grief. We cannot replace those we have lost. But we can know that in grief we do not walk alone. The Lord our God, and our friends and family here at GPC walk with us. The losses we have experienced here will take time to navigate. There are holes that are left in the wake of folks who have moved on that need to be filled. None so much as in the office where our new office manager is figuring out how to do the work required, and I am still trying to get into the new swing of things juggling all the New Mom balls that are up in the air. It is a difficult time that will pass with your patience, prayers, and support.

The church's deficit is over \$27,000 which is needed to cover our operating costs. It is true that we always have a deficit. Much like any Church our size. To be honest, I consider it a sign of the Spiritual health of this church that we continue to have faith that the ministry is more important than the budget. The alternative is cutting back on all that we do, to the point that we only come to worship on Sunday mornings - no missions, no opening our doors to the community, no Sunday School, and part-time staff. The fact of the matter is the reality of our present situation that the cost of living has risen for everyone. Which puts a strain on the church budget, and I'm sure, your own budgets as well. I ask you all to consider what the church means to you, and our present situation to see what you can give over and above your pledged amount. Then I humbly ask that you consider all of this while pledging for 2024.

As we know, stewardship is not just about money. It is also about your time and commitment to the church. What we need more than ever is your prayers and presence. We need to see you in worship and talk to you at fellowship. We need your energy and your encouragement. We just need you!

I know that the Lord Jesus will provide for our future while we concern ourselves with the present. I also know that our small but mighty church has many more joys than concerns. The love and commitment I see in this church is amazing and together we can meet all of these concerns with confidence in one another and assurance in the Lord Jesus.
